Dallas Black Dance Theatre's Director's Choice Taps Social Media Feedback in Work by New Artistic Director Bridget L. Moore

Dallas, TX - Social media takes a role in the development of a world premiere by **Dallas Black Dance Theatre's (DBDT)** new **Artistic Director Bridget L. Moore** during the Director's Choice series. Other works in this series depict conquering emotional ghosts and enduring emotional storms. Presented by **Texas Instruments**, the Director's Choice series will be held Nov. 3, 2017 through Nov. 5, 2017 at the Dee and Charles Wyly Theatre, 2400 Flora Street, Dallas, TX.

Moore is expanding the duet *Uncharted Territory* that received rave reviews last season, into the full company work *Uncharted Territory: Body of Evidence.* "I am using social media to gain cultural perspectives and will document how it informs my choreographic choices. I want to use social media because it is accessible and I think it is a great tool to share experiences," says Bridget L. Moore. Uncharted Territory has been selected as a recipient of a grant from the **TACA Donna Wilhelm Family New Works Fund.**

Texas Instruments has supported Director's Choice as the presenting sponsor for almost a decade. "Dallas Black Dance Theatre makes world class performing arts accessible to North Texas residents and visitors," said **Andy Smith**, director of corporate philanthropy at Texas Instruments. Choreographer **Andy Noble** describes his work *Tower* as an athletic, contemporary, rain dance, complete with 22 dancers on stage formulating a brewing storm. The musical backdrop is "Weather One" by **Michael Gordon**. Noble, the co-artistic director of **NobleMotion Dance**, is from Houston and survived Hurricane Harvey.

Juel D. Lane both choreographed *How to Kill a Ghost* and wrote the lyrics to original music by **Quentin EQ Johnson**. The work tackles the haunting effects of holding onto something that no longer exists. The dance is a mixture of modern, African, Hip Hop and Jazz styles set to R&B and New Age music.

In *Monophonic*, **Rebecca Troyak** creates a duet reflecting the relationship between dance partners. The contemporary dance is a high cardio work set to Opera music. Troyak is a **Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts** alum.

About Dallas Black Dance Theatre

Founded in 1976 by **Ann Williams**, Dallas Black Dance Theatre (DBDT) is the 10th largest minority arts organization in America, the fourth largest black dance company in the nation and the oldest continuously operating professional dance company in the city of Dallas.

The mission of Dallas Black Dance Theatre is to create and produce contemporary modern dance at its highest level of artistic excellence through performances and educational programs that bridge cultures and reach diverse communities. In its 41-year history, Dallas Black Dance Theatre, the nationally and internationally recognized modern dance company, has performed on five continents, in 15 countries and 31 states, including two Olympic Cultural events. During that time, more than 4 million arts patrons and 2.6 million students, grades K-12, have experienced the dance company's performances and educational outreach programs.

Dallas Black Dance Theatre is comprised of five performing companies and its training Academy. Under the helm of Artistic Director Bridget L. Moore, Dallas Black Dance Theatre's professional company, DBDT, consists of 12 full-time salaried dancers performing a mixed repertory of modern, jazz, African and spiritual works by national and international choreographers. Classes are held at DBDT's studios and are open to children starting at age four and adults. The academy has three performing ensembles: Allegro, DBDT's premier academy ensemble, Senior Performing Ensemble, and Junior Performing Ensemble.
